Fellow was born July 20, 1953 and lived to be 12 years old. He was sired by HUSKY BRUNO of DALADAY and out of TOMARS TIGAR LADY. He was bred by L.S. and M.V. Bushwood of Skyesville, Maryland. He was not a Champion and neither was his sire and dam, but he had lots of ancestors that were champions.


We entered Fellow Boy in Obedience School when he grew to be so big and strong at the age of eight months. We felt we would enjoy him more if he had better manners.

Fellow was my dog so he and I started classes together, but it only took two lessons, two almost broken fingers, and numerous bruises to let me know my 110 pounds could not get the obedience point across to this big active boy. At that point my 200-pound husband, John, took over and did a beautiful job with him in obedience and conformation.

Fellow was very intelligent but I know you hear that from all parents. We have had several UD Poodles since and Fellow learned his exercises just a quickly as they did. Fellow was at a great disadvantage because he was our first dog to train and show. We showed Fellow in both obedience and conformation. We showed in obedience first and then obedience and conformation at the same time. His obedience training was a great advantage in the conformation ring. One of the disadvantages we had in conformation was finding shows in our area with enough dogs entered to make a major. Fellow attained 12 points with one major.

Fellow Boy received his CD title October 31, 1954. At that time we were very busy raising our family and establishing our careers so we neglected poor Fellow Boy's career. He had already established good manners from his CD obedience training and was a joy to have around the house. When we got going again he received his CDX title on June 5, 1960, and his UD title on November 5, 1961. He was a very good working dog. He worked with spirit and enjoyed every minute of it. Fellow was 26 inches at the withers and could jump that with no trouble and at the tender age of EIGHT years old when he attained his UD!

Fellow drew the attention of everyone that saw him. He had his picture in the Philadelphia Inquirer and Baltimore Sun.


