Aristocrat was conceived from frozen semen. When his sire, CH Aksala's Arie was being shown in California by Melody Salmi, he was collected and his semen was left for Michele & Jack Mulligan to use on one of their bitches. They chose CH Janelle's in the Nic of Time, a large powerful bitch who clicked with Arie, a past Specialty record holder, a National Specialty winner and a multiple all-breed best in show winner.

On first sight it was instant love for this flashy, energetic puppy. After being squeezed into a Sherpa bag, he flew from California to Hopewell, NJ and his new home.

He finished his championship, won a specialty, placed in the group while we waited for Melody Salmi to return from her break from the dog show world. His striking resemblance to his father brought tears to her eyes and she agreed to come back to give it another try.

Always a powerful Saint as he matured, it became apparent that he was destined to break records. He is the first Saint to attain Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum Grand Championships. He won Westminster in 2013 & 2014, was on TV representing the big dogs at the press conference and at a Rangers hockey game.

He earned his BN, RN, CGCA and participated in Team Rally for two years at the National. As his father, he is a multiple All-Breed Best in Show winner, one being on the prestigious Montgomery Terrier Weekend at Hatboro KC with over 2000 entries. The all-breed judge, Kathleen Steen announced in the ring as she awarded him this honor, "The most beautiful Saint I have ever seen came into my ring this morning" and he deserves to be awarded Best in Show.

He was a Top 20 Working dog, #1 Saint in all categories for 2013 and all-breed in 2012. In 2014 he was the #1 Breed and Specialty winner. After Westminster in 2014 he retired from all-breed showing.

Without the vision of Michele and Jack Mulligan, the tenacity and love of Melody Salmi, and the belief of his owners that he is the most lovable, beautiful, Saint and deserving of his record breaking status, history would not have been made.
