
The Saint Bernard Hall of Fame

Credited for saving <u>over 40 lives</u> in the Swiss Alps in the 1800s. Let us not forget the roots of our breed and the record of which we are the most proud.

From the time the FIRST traveler was rescued by a Saint Bernard until today, our breed has been setting records and creating goals for others. We don't know who was the first Saint Bernard to make a rescue at the Saint Bernard Pass; that piece of history has been lost in the passage of time. In the United States, we now know of the first Saint Bernards which completed a variety of American Kennel Club titles and other accomplishments. Many of these events and titles are our way of keeping the history of the breed alive. It may not be the act of digging out a lost traveler in the snow, but the events reward and help preserve the conformation, obedience, tracking, agility, weight pulling, draft work and temperament of the Saint Bernard. The dogs in the Saint Bernard National Hall of Fame have set records in many of the different Hall of Fame categories. These records not only give recognition to the dog and handler teams which we can all be proud of, but they also set goals for us to try and achieve or surpass. The goals to preserve, protect and improve the breed we love are never ending.





The Purpose of the Saint Bernard National Archives & Hall of Fame

The Saint Bernard National Archives and Hall of Fame were created with one main goal in mind - to create a composite of records of the breed. Before the establishment of the National Archives, there were no complete sets of records on what the Saint Bernard had accomplished in the United States. Researching over the course of three decades, we now have these records 98% complete, thus having a history of what the Saint Bernard has done in America **since 1879**. Dogs that have been inducted into the Hall of Fame have been given their recognition and will not be forgotten as time passes. We continue to tabulate and update data on the Saint Bernards' accomplishments in the following categories:

Criteria & Plateaus of Excellence

CRITERIA FOR INDUCTION INTO THE HALL OF FAME

Only American Kennel Club (AKC) or Saint Bernard Club of America (SBCA) TITLES, SHOWS, TRIALS, TESTS ARE ELIGIBLE

*Producing 5 Champion Get or 4 Champion Get plus the fifth Get with either a CDX, PCDX, GO, PUTD, VER, or Tracking title or 2 Agility titles

*Producing 4 Champion Get or 3 Champion Get plus the fourth Get with either a CDX, PCDX, GO, PUTD, VER, or Tracking title or 2 Agility titles

SHOW WINS:

*Winning 3 Best In Show at All-Breed Shows

SAINT BERNARD INDEPENDENT SPECIALTY WINS:

*Winning 5 Best of Breed or 5 Best of Opposite Sex or a combination totaling 5, PLUS 1 SBCA BOB and/or BOS win

*Winning 10 Best of Breed or 10 Best of Opposite Sex or a combination totaling 10 (SBCA wins can be part of the count total)

*Winning 5 Saint Bernard High in Trials at independent specialties, PLUS 1 SBCA High in Trial win

*Winning 10 Saint Bernard High in Trials at independent specialties (SBCA wins can be part of the count total)

*Winning 2 Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex or combination totaling 2 at the Saint Bernard Club of America's National *Winning Best of Breed and High in Trial (same dog) at the SAME independent specialty show

BREED & PERFORMANCE—AGILITY, OBEDIENCE (EXCLUDING BN TITLE & RALLY TITLES) & TRACKING

*Earning any combination of THREE Agility, Obedience (excluding BN title & Rally titles) or Tracking titles

*Earning any combination of TWO Agility, Obedience (excluding BN title & Rally titles) or Tracking titles + Championship title

*Earning any combination of ONE Agility, Obedience (excluding BN title & Rally titles) or Tracking titles + Champion and Grand Championship title

*Earing any combination of THREE Championship titles

PLATEAUS OF EXCELLENCE

Higher Plateaus may be earned each time a Saint Bernard achieves:

SIRES:

*Higher Plateaus earned for each additional 5 Champion Get. or

*Producing 9 Champions plus a tenth Get with a CDX (or PCDX, GO, PUTD or VER) or Tracking title, or 2 Agility titles, or

*Producing 8 Champions plus two different Get with a CDX (or PCDX, GO, PUTD or VER) or Tracking title or 2 Agility titles

*Higher Plateaus earned for each additional 2 Champion Get, or

*Producing 5 Champions plus a sixth with a CDX (or PCDX, GO, PUTD or VER) or Tracking title, or 2 Agility titles, or

*Producing 6 Champions plus two different Get with a CDX (or PCDX, GO, PUTD or VER) or Tracking title or 2 Agility titles

SHOW WINS:

*Higher Plateaus earned for each additional 3 Best In Show wins at All-Breed Shows

GROUP WINS:

*Higher Plateaus earned for each additional 10 Group Firsts

SAINT BERNARD INDEPENDENT SPECIALTY WINS

- *Higher Plateaus earned for each additional 5 Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex or combination, PLUS 2 SBCA BOB/BOS
- *Higher Plateaus earned for each additional 10 Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex or combination of 10
- *Higher Plateaus earned for each 5 additional Saint Bernard High In Trials at independent specialties, PLUS 2 SBCA HITs
- *Higher Plateaus earned for each 10 additional Saint Bernard High In Trials at independent specialties
- *Higher Plateaus earned for each 2 additional Saint Bernard Club of America National wins of Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex or combination of 2, or for each 2 additional High In Trials

BREED & PERFORMANCE—AGILITY, OBEDIENCE, TRACKING & SBC OF AMERICA'S WORKING DOG CHAMPIONSHIP

- *Achieving a OTCh (Obedience Trial Champion)
- *Achieving a OM1, or OM2, or OM3, or OM4, or OM5, or OM6, or OM7, or OM8, or OM9, or OGM
- *Achieving a MACh (Master Agility Champion)
- *Achieving a PACh (Preferred Master Agility Champion)
- *Achieving a VCD 1,2,3,4,or 5 (Versatile Companion Dog)
- *Achieving a UDX (Utility Dog Excellent)
- *Achieving a PAX (Preferred Agility Excellent)
- *Achieving 10 Double Qualifies (2Qs) in Agility with at least one (1) from the Excellent classes.
- *Achieving 10 Double Qualifies (2Qs) in Agility Excellent B

- *Achieving a 200 score from a regular class
- *Achieving 50 qualifying scores from the regular classes of Open, Utility or VER Obedience
- *Achieving 25 qualifying scores from the advanced classes of Open/Excellent Agility
- *Higher Plateaus earned for each additional 50 scores from the regular classes of Open, Utility or VER Obedience
- *Higher Plateaus earned for each additional 25 qualifying scores from the advanced classes of Open/Excellent Agility
- *Higher Plateaus earned for each additional 5 All-Breed AKC High in Trials
- *Achieving Saint Bernard Club of America Working Dog Championship (after induction)
- *Achieving a Breed Championship with a Saint Bernard Club of America's Working Dog Championship
