a member, which may be placed highest in its class, will alone be qualified to compete.

Section 4. In order for members to be eligible for competitions for the Club prizes, he shall be a duly qualified member of the Club at the time of closing of entries of the show where such competition is to take place. A member winning two or more medals, may select some appropriate trophy suitably inscribed, in the place of the medals, if he desires to do so. The cost of the trophy to the Club, however, must not be greater than the cost of the medals.

Section 5. The Secretary-Treasurer of the Club shall furnish a list of the members to the Secretary of each show where the Club prizes are offered.

Article XI.

Amendments.

These By-Laws may be altered at any regular meeting of the Club, or of the Board of Governors, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present and represented by mail vote, provided thirty days notice has been given by the Secretary-Treasurer.
